



# Our Initiatives / Activities

## **Livestock Development**

# A) Integrated Livestock Development Centres (ILDCs)

Livestock development forms the core of the JK Trust's initiatives. The main objective of livestock development activities is to upgrade the local indigenous low milk-yielding cows and buffaloes by breeding them through Artificial Insemination (AI) with the use of high pedigree frozen semen of indigenous/exotic breeds. The resulting upgraded progeny with an improved genetic makeup will have a far better milk-yielding capacity.



This is achieved through a special programme

called 'Cattle Breed Improvement Program (CBIP)' using an innovative project concept of 'Integrated Livestock Development Centre (ILDC)'. The programme operator referred to as 'Gopal' is the one who runs each centre and is an educated rural youngster who is extensively trained for four months to carry out animal breeding, health and nutrition-related services.

The Gopal is provided with a motorcycle to carry out breeding and other veterinary services like veterinary first aid, castration of scrub bulls, de-worming, preventive vaccination against various diseases, infertility treatment etc. at the doorsteps of the farmers. Gopals are supervised by qualified veterinarians. The entire programme is monitored by a hierarchy of monitoring officers and project managers at the village-block-district-state level and controlled centrally from our Head Office in Mumbai.

The Trust is operating a network of 3,777 ILD Centres in 118 Districts of Maharashtra, Punjab, Haryana, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Rajasthan, Karnataka, Telangana & Odisha as on  $31^{\rm st}$  Dec., 2015. Through these Centres, we are providing veterinary services to over 37,000 villages in these states.

#### B) Mobile Veterinary Units (MVUs)

Realising the significance of timely availability of veterinary services for efficient livestock management, the Trust has started the project of MVUs to provide preventive, curative, advisory and breeding services at the farmers' doorsteps, control and contain disease outbreaks and support and strengthen the activities taken through ILDCs.

Each MVU runs six days a week and covers two ILDCs per day as per a fixed schedule. Route charts are prepared and communicated to the villagers. Gopals and Monitoring Officers are informed well in advance to make suitable local arrangements



and organise the visit and operation of the MVU. Cases such as pregnancy diagnosis, infertility, de-worming and other cases referred by the Gopals to the MVUs are examined and treated by experienced veterinarians.

# Our Initiatives / Activities

## **Livestock Development**

#### C) Dairy Call Centre

JK Trust has started a Call Centre to cater to the needs of dairy farmers of Haryana. Farmers can request for AI services at their doorsteps by registering their requirement at the Toll Free number 1800-1800-088. The Gopal who is nearest to the farmer will get intimation from the Call Centre, so that he can attend the case. The farmer would also get the details of the Gopal who would be attending his case. This is a unique initiative intended to benefit the dairy farmers of Haryana.

#### **Animal Nutrition**

The significance of nutritious fodder lies in the fact that it can enhance the milk production capability of the farmers' livestock, thereby enabling an enhancement in his income levels. The fodder need of an enhanced animal also goes up. And hence, good quality fodder needs to be supplemented. JK Trust through the medium of Fodder Multiplication Centres and Fodder Seeds Development Centres equips and supports the farmers with the know-how of scientifically proven methods to increase yield and also be self-reliant to address the need of livestock for nutritious fodder.

#### A) Fodder Multiplication Centres (FMCs)

Fodder Multiplication Centres (FMCs) are established in areas of operation of ILDCs. Each FMC covers an operational area of five ILDCs. Fodder Development Officers posted at these Centres create awareness among the farmers regarding the requirement of nutritional fodder crops and their cultivation methods. They supply fodder seeds/plantation materials, conduct practical demonstrations at field level and provide training to the farmers throughout the year, thereby helping the farmers to meet the nutritional requirement of their animals.

# B) Fodder Seeds Development Centres (FSDCs)

FSDCs take up the activities necessary to meet the demand of farmers for quality fodder seeds/saplings to cultivate fodder crops. Oats, Berseem, Maize, Hybrid Napier etc. are cultivated and the seeds are distributed to farmers to cultivate their own fodder.

#### **Animal Nutrition**

#### **C)** Fodder Enrichment

Various fodder enrichment techniques are used to improve the nutritional value of fodder.

Urea Straw Treatment (UST) is a technique for enhancing the nutritional value of dry forage. The Gopal provides the UST kit and conducts the demonstration at the doorstep of the farmer. Treated straw helps in increasing the milk yield of cows.

Silage preparation is used to overcome the scarcity of fodder in lean season by treating and storing the excess green fodder in flush season. It is a means of preservation of chaffed green fodder in an anaerobic condition through the adoption of a fermentation method. In the anaerobic condition, sugar contained in green fodder is converted into lactic acid by micro-organisms and this helps in preserving the green fodder for a longer duration.

Azolla is an aquatic floating fern which is gaining increasing popularity as a livestock fodder owing to its high nutritional value. Azolla can be cultivated in small makeshift tanks in the backyard of farmers at a very nominal investment. It multiplies fast and can replace part of green fodder in the diet of animals.

### **Training and Extension**

JK Trust understands the importance of right training for the successful implementation of projects at the grassroots level. We are imparting training to selected, educated rural youth in the areas of cattle breeding, animal health, fodder cultivation etc. through theory as well as practical sessions at Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Training Institute for Rural Development situated at Gopalnagar, Chhattisgarh.



The trained youth, the 'Gopal', in turn conducts a number of extension meetings at field level to create awareness about good practices and latest scientific knowledge to enhance the productivity of animals.

### **Women Empowerment**

The unemployed women in rural areas are identified and given an opportunity to associate with JK Trust as "Lady Gopals", with the responsibility of running an ILDC. These women are then provided training in animal breeding and other veterinary services and have now become a symbol of empowerment in this maledominated sector.

Thus, a Lady Gopal's activities under our Van Bhagini Project in Gujarat not only helps the local farmers to increase their earnings, but also makes her more confident about her abilities to manage, lead and be an independent, self-earning woman.




# Pan India – Our Progress over the years

In the year 1997, JK Trust Gram Vikas Yojana was launched to channelise the three decades worth of technical expertise gained by the scientists of Raymond Sheep Breeding Farm towards rural India for the benefit of thousands of farmers. Artificial insemination in cattle and buffaloes was adopted as a tool of scientific breeding to improve the milk production of the cattle of the country.

We started our first ILDC in the state of Chhattisgarh in 1997 and after working in the state for a period of three years, we extended our operations to the state of Madhya Pradesh in the year 2000. Gradually we started getting projects from different state governments under different schemes and as on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2015, we operate a total of 3777 ILDCs spread across 10 states of India. In the current year, we started implementing CSR projects of leading corporate companies as well. The details of state wise operations and the CSR projects undertaken are given in the subsequent pages.

Starting from 1997, the Trust has shown a steady progress in the number of ILDCs, the geographical coverage and the services provided. The graphs below show the progress made by JK Trust ILDCs in all operational states over the past years;





## Chhattisgarh

#### Introduction

JK Trust started Cattle Breed Improvement Program (CBIP) in Chhattisgarh in the year 1997 in 11 districts under SGSY (Swarnajayanti Gram Swarozgar Yojana) scheme (1997-2002). From 1997 onwards, for the past 18 years, various funding agencies have put their faith in us for implementing animal husbandry-related projects. We have successfully implemented the projects sponsored by the Department of Animal Husbandry, Govt. of Chhattisgarh, BRGF (Backward Regions Grant Fund), RSVY (Rashtriya Sam Vikas Yojana), Tribal Welfare Department and Special SGSY. We had also implemented



Chhattisgarh District Poverty Reduction Project (CGDPRP) funded by World Bank through Department of Rural Development, Govt. of Chhattisgarh from 2004-2009.

The Tribal Innovative Project of 100 ILDCs has been successfully completed in the state in the year 2015. Though the Special SGSY project of 145 centres was completed in the year 2014 itself, calf reporting from this project was still continuing in the year 2015. At present, in Chhattisgarh State, we are operating 145 Integrated Livestock Development Centres (ILDCs), 29 Fodder Multiplication Centres (FMCs) and 1 Fodder Seed Development Centre (FSDC) under RKVY (Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana) scheme with Department of Animal Husbandry. In addition, we are also operating 30 ILDCs and 3 Mobile Veterinary Units (MVUs) with Chhattisgarh State Co-operative Milk Federation.

We also run the CSR project of Raymond Ltd in the state, in which we are providing animal husbandry related services to farmers by operating ILDCs and Mobile Veterinary Vans.



Through the FMCs located at the households of the farmers, we could demonstrate the cultivation of improved fodder varieties and the enhancement of milk production by introducing them to the feeding schedule of animals.

#### **Project Performance of FSDCs**

A total of 43,042 kg of fodder seeds was produced in our FSDC in the year 2015. This included both kharif as well as rabi crops. In addition, 71 lakh slips of hybrid napier was also produced in the last year.

In order to disseminate the latest and appropriate technologies related to improved fodder production, conservation and enrichment to the beneficiary farmers of Chhattisgarh, a number of one day training-cumexposure programmes have been organised at our FSDC at Chandkhuri. Many officers from the Dept. of Animal Husbandry and Members of Co-operative Milk Societies attended these programmes. A total of 1,446 farmers have benefited from these trainings.

#### Mineral Mixture & Fodder Promotion

Improved animals need a higher plane of nutrition to achieve maximum production potential. Understanding this critical role of nutrition, the Trust has extended a number of services in this area as well. We have supplied mineral mixture as well as feed supplements so that the nutritional requirements of these improved animals are met. The Trust has distributed 4,028 kg of mineral mixture, 66 litres of oral calcium and 75 strips of feed supplement boluses in the state of Chhattisgarh during the year 2015.



## **Gujarat**

#### Introduction

We have started working in the state of Gujarat in 2007, when we were given the responsibility of setting up 100 ILD Centres each in Jamnagar, Surendranagar and Dahod districts by the State government. After successful completion of this project, in the year 2008, we were sanctioned 150 Centres by the Tribal Development department.

In August 2010, the JK Trust started a unique initiative in Gujarat under the name, Van Bhagini Project. As indicated by the name, the project envisaged the opening of 140 ILD Centres in tribal





blocks of Chhota Udepur district being managed entirely by Lady Gopals from tribal families. This is one of a kind initiative in the history of JK Trust and has been quite successful in terms of target achievement as well as making the Lady Gopals self reliant. Most of these Centres have completed their 5-year project period in the year 2015 and are running as self-sustainable centres with support from the Trust.



### Haryana

#### Introduction

The CBIP was initiated in Haryana state in the year 2009. With the funding from RKVY (Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana), initially, 145 ILDCs were established in Mewat and Shivalik regions of the state by the JK Trust in collaboration with the Dept. of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Govt. of Haryana. Later, this project was expanded to the remaining regions covering entire Haryana with the establishment of 1,000 ILDCs in the year 2010.


The first project of 140 Centres has successfully completed its project tenure in the year 2015, though the second project of 1,000 Centres is still in operation. In addition to these government projects, this year onwards, we are implementing the CSR projects of 2 companies namely; JK Cement Ltd and Aditya Birla GBTL Jan Kalyan Trust. Under these CSR projects, JK Trust is currently operating 25 Integrated Livestock Development Centres (ILDCs), 20 in Jhajjar District and 05 in Bhiwani District of the State. The aim of this project is to provide animal breeding and animal health services at affordable rates to farmers in the vicinity of the plants of JK Cement Ltd and Grasim Bhiwani Textiles Ltd.



### **Jharkhand**

#### JK Trust enters Jharkhand

One of our major achievements in spreading our footprints in eastern India was the signing of an MoU between JK Trust and JSIA (Jharkhand State Implementing Agency) on 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2015 to take over and operate 430 AI centres hitherto operated by the JSIA. The JSIA is an agency promoted by the Animal Husbandry Department (AHD), Jharkhand for formulating policies, conducting trainings and creating various assets for cattle and buffalo development in Jharkhand state.

This new initiative by the Jharkhand Govt. has given the JK Trust a big responsibility of producing large number of crossbred/upgraded calves in the State known for a sporadic cattle population. Selected centres in 24 districts of the State are covered under this programme.

As a first step towards operationalisation of the project, the selection of Gopals has been done through walk in interviews in all the districts. The State office and divisional office locations were finalised near Khelgaon, Jharkhand state museum and Deoghar respectively. The manpower selection for field operation, monitoring and management of the project was started and we are optimistic that all the 430 AI Centres will be in operation early next year.

#### Karnataka

#### Introduction

JK Trust made its first entry into the state of Karnataka towards the end of 2015 by undertaking the CSR project of Fullerton India 'Pashu Vikas' project.

In the month of Nov. 2015, the Trust has set up five Integrated Livestock Development Centres in Belgaum district of Karnataka to provide doorstep facility of Artificial Insemination & Other Veterinary services to dairy farmers. This initiative will provide services like artificial insemination, castration, fodder management, first aid and extension services with a view to develop high milk yielding progeny animals.

## **Madhya Pradesh**


#### Introduction

Starting from September 2000, the Trust has undertaken a number of projects including SGSY, Special SGSY, RSVY, NPY and BRGF sponsored projects in the state of Madhya Pradesh. We have also undertaken Madhya Pradesh Rural Livelihoods Project (MPRLP) - Phase One, funded by the Department for International Development (DFID), U.K., in four predominantly tribal districts namely Mandla, Dindori, Shahdol and Anuppur.

The projects handled in the year 2015 are NPY and BRGF funded cattle breed improvement projects. Starting from 2015, the Trust has undertaken a number of Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) projects sponsored by Raymond Ltd, Fullerton India Credit Company Ltd, JK Tyre & Industries Ltd and Godrej Agrovet Ltd in the state of Madhya Pradesh.

#### **Maharashtra**

#### Launch of RKVY project in Jalgaon -Maharashtra

RKVY-funded Cattle Breed Improvement Project of Maharashtra State was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Minister of Agriculture, Mr. Eknath Rao Khadse on 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2015 at a grand function held in Jalgaon. Mr. Sanjay Sawkare - Minister of State for Agriculture, Dr. A T Kumbhar - Commissioner, Animal Husbandry, Govt. of Maharashtra, Dr. H D Gaikwad - CEO, MLDB and Dr. S Sawant - Additional Commissioner of Animal Husbandry were the



eminent guests present on the occasion. The programme was a huge success with about 5,000 farmers attending the function.

The Work Order of the project for working in 27 districts of Maharashtra was handed over to Dr. Shyam Zawar, CEO, JK Trust by the Hon'ble Minister, Mr. Eknath Rao Khadse.

The Chief Guest had expressed concern on the prevailing financial status of farmers of those districts and was hopeful that the RKVY project entrusted to JK Trust will enhance the milk production of cattle and help in improving the economic conditions of the beneficiary farmers of the area.

Centre establishment was taken up on a warfooting basis and at the close of the year; the Trust is operating 994 ILD Centres under this RKVY project. We are also undertaking CSR projects in the State. Five ILDCs sponsored by Fullerton India Credit Co. Ltd as part of their CSR project and 80 ILDCs sponsored by Raymond Ltd. are operating in the State as on 31<sup>st</sup> Dec., 2015. In addition, we also run 5 ILDCs under SAGY (Saansad Adarsh Gram Yojana) in Pune and Satara districts. Hence, in total, we are operating 1,084 Centres in Maharashtra as on 31<sup>st</sup> Dec., 2015.



#### **Project Performance**

A total of 1,63,740 Artificial Inseminations were done in Maharashtra by JK Trust in the year 2015. Calves are expected from these AIs starting from February 2016 onwards. In addition to AI, the Gopals are providing other veterinary services also at the doorsteps of farmers. A total of 6773 castrations were done in the State in the year 2015.

#### **Odisha**

#### Introduction

JK Trust initiated Cattle Breed Improvement Program (CBIP) in Odisha State in the year 2012 with support from the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, Government of India. Since then, JK Trust has been operating 620 Integrated Livestock Development (ILD) Centres in 13 tribal districts in collaboration with the ST & SC Development Department and Fisheries and Animal Resources Development Department of the Govt. of Odisha. Till December 2015, a total of 4,12,652 Artificial Inseminations have been performed and 67,385 high genetic merit calves are born. Besides, the Gopals of the Trust have been providing a variety of other



veterinary support services like castrations, vaccinations, first aid, infertility, de-worming etc.

In the year 2014, 64 ILD Centres were sanctioned under RKVY for 3 districts of Cuttack, Nayagarh and Dhenkanal. Out of 64 Centres, 56 Centres are operational and the remaining 8 Centres will be started shortly.

JK Trust signed, in August 2015, another agreement with L&T Finance Limited, a wholly owned subsidiary of L&T Finance Holdings Limited, for starting 100 ILD Centres under CSR funding in 3 districts of Bhadrak, Cuttack and Jajpur. The Centres have been identified and Gopals are currently undergoing technical training at Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Training Institute for Rural Development at Gopalnagar in Chhattisgarh. These Centres shall be operational by the 1<sup>st</sup> half of the year 2016. This is the single largest CSR project of the JK Trust.



#### Introduction


In 2010, Punjab State Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation Ltd. (MILKFED) entrusted JK Trust with the responsibility of starting and operating 100 IBDCs (Integrated Buffalo Development Centres) in the State. The project was successfully completed in December 2014. However, calf verification and associated other veterinary services like de-worming and first aid were continued in the year 2015 also. Another project was sanctioned in the year 2012 under the Integrated Watershed Management Programme (IWMP). So far, 28 ILDCs have been established under the IWMP project.

# Rajasthan

#### Spreading our wings to Rajasthan

The JK Trust won the bid to establish 2,000 Integrated Livestock Development Centres in Rajasthan for providing services of Artificial Insemination and Veterinary First Aid to cows & buffaloes at the doorsteps of the farmers.



An agreement was signed between the CEO, Rajasthan Livestock Development Board, Jaipur & the Director, Department of Animal Husbandry, Government of Rajasthan, as one part & JK Trust, as the second part on 1<sup>st</sup> June, 2015 for the establishment of 2,000 ILD Centres covering 30 districts of Rajasthan.

Steps have been initiated to start the project at the earliest. A series of walk-in interviews were conducted at Chittaurgarh, Kota, Jodhpur and Bharatpur Divisions for the selection of suitable candidates. Selected candidates have been sent for intensive training at our Training Institute in Gopalnagar. Centres are expected to start functioning early next year.

#### **CSR** project

In Rajasthan, we are running 40 ILDCs under the CSR project of JK Cement Ltd. Agreement was signed on

 $23^{\rm rd}$  February, 2015 for the establishment of 40 ILD Centres in various blocks of Chittaurgarh and Pratapgarh Districts of Rajasthan.

The project was launched on 19<sup>th</sup> May, 2015 at Atal Sewa Kendra, Karunda, Nimbahera. The Chief Guest of this programme was Hon'ble MLA, Shri Chand Kriplani. Special Guest was Shri Ved Prakash, District Collector, Chittaurgarh. ## Telangana

#### Expanding our network to Telangana

The Ministry of Tribal Affairs - Govt. of India had sanctioned a project under Article 275 (1) to JK Trust for the establishment of 192 Integrated Livestock Development Centres (ILDCs) in the Tribal Districts of Adilabad, Khammam and Warangal of Telangana State to provide animal breeding and other allied services.

The signing of the MoU between Mr. Ekka, Managing Director, TRICOR (Telangana State Scheduled Tribes Cooperative Finance Corporation Ltd.) and Director, JK Trust took place on 2<sup>nd</sup> April, 2015.

After the commencement of 157 centres under this project, an official launch programme was organised by the Tribal Department in Jodeghat (Adilabad District) on 27<sup>th</sup> October, 2015; wherein the event of bikes distribution to 98 Gopals was flagged off by the Hon'ble Minister for IT & Panchayati Raj - Mr. K.T. Rao. The other dignitaries present on the occasion



were Mr. Chandulal Azmeera (Minister for Tribal Affairs, Telangana), Mr. Jogu Ramanna (Forest Minister, Telangana), MPs, MLAs, District Collector & PO, ITDA (Integrated Tribal Development Agency), Bhadrachalam.

#### **Gopal Training of Tribal Candidates**

Local educated, unemployed youth candidates from the ST community were identified in consultation with the concerned Integrated Tribal Development Agencies (ITDAs) to work as Gopals in the ILD Centres. All these 192 candidates have undergone 4 months intensive Gopal training. The first two months of classroom training has been provided by the Govt. Regional Animal Husbandry Training Centres (RAHTC) of Khammam and Warangal and DAHT (Khammam).

This theory training was followed by two months of Field Training in Odisha. After thorough training in Artificial Insemination, Castration and First Aid treatments, the successful candidates were posted as "Gopals" at various centres.

# **Upcoming Projects**

The Trust is venturing into a number of ambitious projects, the details of which are given hereunder:

# 1) Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Centre of Excellence for Assisted Reproductive Technologies in Livestock, Pune

The Trust is establishing a state-of-the-art Institute namely 'Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Centre of Excellence for Assisted Reproductive Technologies in Livestock' at Vadgaon, Pune, Maharashtra. This Institute will carry out research in advanced Assisted Reproductive Technologies like In-Vitro Fertilisation (IVF) and Embryo Transfer (ET) in cattle and will substantially contribute to the genetic improvement of the cattle in the State of Maharashtra and all over India. The male calves born out of these embryos will be used for semen production at our upcoming Semen Station in Raipur. The semen produced out of these progeny will be used for genetic improvement of cattle throughout the country.

Construction work was started in November 2015 and is going on in full swing at the 42 acres of land located at Vadgaon, Pune. The construction of one cattle shed housing 100 heifers is already complete and the construction of a second shed with a capacity to house another 100 more heifers is expected to be complete by June 2016. In addition to the lab and cattle sheds, there will also be facility for staff quarters and administrative building. The entire facility is expected to be ready by August 2016.

Hundred healthy crossbred recipients are already housed in the cattle sheds. We are currently in the process of importing embryos of superior genetic merit from Semex, Canada. With the imported embryos, we plan to start the work of ET and IVF trials in the month of September 2016.

The land is fully irrigated with micro irrigation system. Fodder production is brought under the supervision of qualified staff. Fodder like lucerne, maize and oat are cultivated in the farm to meet the green fodder requirement of animals.

#### 2) Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Centre of Excellence in Bovine Genetics, Raipur

The proposed Mega Semen Station, named as 'Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Centre of Excellence in Bovine Genetics, Raipur' will be coming up in 68.92 acres of land located at Village Hasda at Tehsil Berla, District Bemetara in Chhattisgarh. The proposed state-of-the- art Centre is being supported by the Government of India and Govt. of Chhattisgarh. The location of the Centre is just 30 kms from Raipur which is well connected to all parts of the country by road, rail and air.

Civil construction of the proposed Centre is expected to start from April 2016 and we expect to start semen production in the year 2018. Considering the rapid growth in the activities of the Trust in the recent past and its business expansion plans, we are hopeful that this Institute with a proposed capacity of 5 million semen doses per annum (expandable to 10 million) will meet the captive requirements of the Trust. Further, this could also cater to the demand of quality semen doses in different states of the country, thereby helping in genetic improvement of the cattle.

# **Upcoming Projects**

3) Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Centre of Excellence for Assisted Reproductive Technologies in Livestock, Chhattisgarh Unit



The existing lab facility at the Raymond Embryo Research Centre (RERC) in Gopalnagar is getting upgraded and renovated to function as 'Dr. Vijaypat Singhania Centre of Excellence for Assisted Reproductive Technologies in Livestock, Chhattisgarh Unit'. The unit is located at Gopalnagar which is 28 kms from Bilaspur City in Chhattisgarh. This Centre would undertake ET and IVF work in cattle and buffaloes and thereby help in the genetic improvement of bovines of the country.

Good quality donor animals of indigenous breeds like Gir, Sahiwal, Tharparkar and Nellore have been procured and are housed at the cattle shed of the proposed unit. Recipient animals for the trials are also housed at the unit.

Four qualified veterinarians are being sent to the United States for an advanced training in IVF and ET. Upon completion of the training, the trials would start in Chhattisgarh unit in March 2016.

#### 4) Mobile ET Van

Post successful demonstration of IVF and ET in cattle and buffaloes in our labs, the Trust also has an ambitious plan of taking it to the doorsteps of the farmers. With this in mind, we have planned to set up a high tech Mobile Embryo Transfer van with all the necessary equipment, which will cater its services to progressive dairy farmers, for whom, ET progeny calves of superior genetic makeup has been a dream till now. This is a first of its kind initiative in India, wherein Embryo Transfer in bovines would be made mobile.

#### Recognition of JK Trust by Ministry of Rural Development



The Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) had organised a National Workshop on Good Practices in Rural Development Sector in Bhopal on  $23^{\rm rd}$  and  $24^{\rm th}$  September, 2015 so as to bring the best of rural development initiatives to the mainstream debate and provide a platform for their practitioners to interact and share their learnings with the Adarsh Grams identified under SAGY by Hon'ble Members of Parliament.

the new projects / schemes designed and rolled out for them by the government.






Hon'ble Chief Minister of the State Dr. Raman Singh also visited our stall and appreciated our work.

# Journey from a small dairy farmer to a successful entrepreneur

Name of Beneficiary: Mr. S.N. Pandey Village: Kapsa, Block: Sirmor District: Rewa, State: Madhya Pradesh



Mr. S.N. Pandey, a resident of Village Kapsa falling under our ILD Centre - Barha Mudawar, 50 kms from Sirmor Block, District Rewa, Madhya Pradesh, narrates — "Earlier there was no Artificial Insemination (AI) service for crossbreeding of dairy cattle in our village. I had never seen an artificial insemination being done before establishment of ILD Centre in our neighbouring village Barha Mudawar. Earlier, if someone wanted



to avail this facility, he had to take his cow to a faraway government hospital. But, now-a-days, through the ILD Centre run by JK Trust, we are getting this facility at our doorstep by trained Gopals".

Mr. Pandey also adds that he gets valuable information on improved and scientific dairy husbandry practices through various training and awareness camps organised by JK Trust. Adoption of these practices has really helped him to increase the productivity of his dairy farm.

The story dates back to 2009, when JK Trust established an ILD Centre in Village Kapsa. After seeing the services provided by this ILDC, Mr. Pandey thought of expanding his small dairy unit by availing the services from this ILDC and thus came up the **Kamdhenu Dairy** in 2011.

In the year 2013, JK Trust organised an exposure visit to Gujarat for the progressive dairy farmers of Kapsa Village so that they can see the improved dairy husbandry practices first hand and learn from the successful dairy farmers of Gujarat. Mr. Pandey was also a member of that team and the visit helped him to boost his confidence to start the dairy business in a commercial way. He reiterates, "This exposure visit exposed me to various possibilities of my dream. I immersed myself into conceptualising and giving shape to the dairy enterprise as it is today."

He also adds, "I decided to get into dairy farming, as this was a relatively stable and profitable business in an unpredictable world. I could see the business opportunity in the manufacture and sale of various milk products also. I wanted to maximise my profit from dairying through value addition."

Before establishment of this business, Mr. Pandey visited a few more centres again at his own expense to learn the nitty-gritties of this sector. He visited places like Bhakudev Dhab in Karnal, Haldiram in Nagpur and Bikaner etc.

After that, he started 'Kamdhenu Dairy & Sweets'

in Rewa in the year 2014 with full commitment and zeal. He provided services of milk delivery at the customers' doorstep through an autorickshaw.

He started the first 'milk ATM' in their area, which was a new innovation in the area and received much publicity and acceptance.

A steam boiler system was also set up at the sweet manufacturing factory. Steam boiler produces the steam necessary for the production of different value-added dairy products. By adopting such modern technologies, he could reduce the cost of production and this increased his margins.

At present, he has approximately 100 animals in his dairy farm. There are around 30 upgraded/crossbreed calves in his dairy which are due to JK Trust intervention and most of these animals are in milk. The crossbreeding and genetic upgradation has helped him to increase the milk yield of his animals at an average of 15-20 litres per animal per day.

Today, Kamdhenu Dairy produces more than 2,000 litres of milk per day, out of which around 30% comes from nearby villages which have benefited from the increased milk production potential of the F2 progeny produced due to JK Trust's efforts and are in lactation now.

Before the establishment of the project, the production of his cows was very poor as he was getting 2-3 litres of milk/cow/day and his expenditure was more on the animal health. The scenario has changed now and he is able to sell 500 litres of milk per day from his dairy through doorstep services. Surplus milk is used in making sweets, paneer and other dairy products.

Besides increased milk yield, he is also getting guidance on scientific feeding and management of cows receives good quality semen along with doorstep AI facility, preventive healthcare, first aid for his animals and feed supplements from the  $\mbox{ILDC}\,\mbox{of}\,\mbox{JK}\,\mbox{Trust}.$ 

He says that he earns a handsome profit every month from his dairy farm. Besides, he also earns additional income from the sale of sweets and other dairy products.

His neighbours have witnessed his financial status change a lot over the past 2 years. He is now the owner of various properties e.g. this modern dairy and a popular shop in Rewa. However, his dream is to become the owner of the biggest dairy farm in Rewa.

His whole family feels indebted to the JK Trust for bringing happiness and change in their life. Mr. S.N. Pandey has become a live example and role model for a number of unemployed youth in the region.

# Making use of multiple services under one umbrella for overall progress

Name of Beneficiary: Mr. Panchram Basant Village: Sevaiyakala, Block: Pithora District: Mahasamund, State: Chhattisgarh

Mr. Panchram Basant residing at Village Sevaiyakala in Block Pithora of District Mahasamund depended on a few indigenous cows for earning his livelihood. Though he was aspiring to do profitable dairy business, he couldn't, as the milk production of these cows was very low. Though he and his previous generation were maintaining these animals for many years, he had heard of AI as a tool of breed improvement and enhancing the milk production potential of animals. He had never done AI for his animals nor followed any scientific method to increase milk production.

### **Success Stories**

In the year 2009, JK Trust started CBIP in Mahasamund District and established an ILDC (Integrated Livestock Development Centre) at Tappasevaiya and appointed Mr. Rajuram Kshatriya as the Gopal of the Centre. Mr. Kshatriya used to visit each village and meet all animal owners to inform them about the benefit of availing AI (Artificial Insemination) and other veterinary services.

The Gopal conducted a number of extension



meetings with farmers of all the villages covered under the ILDC and convinced them about the benefits of adopting Artificial Insemination in cows and providing nutritious green fodder to their cattle. Like other farmers, Mr. Panchram Basant also got ready to do AI in his cows, though with a little hesitance.

Mr. Panchram was very much happy when he got



his first crossbred calf born out of the AI programme. Slowly, he was convinced of the merits of adopting other scientific feeding and management practices as taught by the Gopal. He adopted all the measures as suggested by the Gopal and also regularly availed checkups for his animals post AI and conception.

To cater to the increased nutrient requirement of the improved animals, he spared 1 acre land for green fodder cultivation on which he grows Hybrid Napier (CO-4), Berseem & Azolla. He has seen the improvement in milk production when he started focusing on feeding of balanced diet to his animals.

Mr. Panchram Basant currently owns 4 cows, 8 heifers and 3 male calves born out of the AI done by the Gopal of the Trust. Due to all these interventions, there has been a jump in the surplus milk available for sale from 10-15 litres/day to 35-40 litres/day and he earns handsome money from the sale of milk in the milk society as well as in the local market. He has also earned Rs. 1 lakh from the sale of 5 cows and Rs. 30,000 from the sale of 3 heifers.

At this stage, the Gopal of the ILD Centre suggested him to build a Biogas Plant in his backyard to make use of the cow dung. Having built a biogas plant, Mr. Panchram says "I am happy that I have found a very good use for cow dung apart from using it as manure. My wife is very happy and comfortable using the biogas for daily cooking. Earlier, she used to burn firewood for cooking purposes. But now she enjoys the comfort of a green fuel and that too at a very low cost". He expresses his gratitude towards JK Trust for helping him to build up valuable assets and provide a better future for his children.


